## LOCAL GOVERNMENT, ENGLAND AND WALES CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS The Ryedale (Parishes) Order 1985

Whereas the Ryedale District Council, acting pursuant to section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972 (a), has made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals about parishes in the district:

And whereas in consequence of those recommendations the Commission has seen fit, pursuant to sections 47, 48(9) and 51(1) of the Act, to make proposals to the Secretary of State:

And whereas more than six weeks has elapsed since those proposals were made:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to the proposals:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:-

## Title and commencement

1. - This order may be cited as the Ryedale (Parishes) Order 1985.

- 2. (1) 1st January 1986 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (a).
- (2) For all other purposes, this order shall come into operation on 1st April 1986.

## Interpretation

3. In this order -

"the boundary maps" means the 7 maps (duly numbered for reference) which are issued by the Department of the Environment as the "Maps of the Ryedale (Parishes) Order 1985";

"county electoral division" means an electoral division of the county of North Yorkshire; and

"district ward" means a ward of the district of Ryedale.

## Transfers between parishes

4. Each area marked on the boundary maps as shown in columns 1 and 2 of Schedule 1 hereto shall be transferred from the relevant parish named in column 3 to that named in column 4.

Where in column 5 there is mentioned in relation to any area -

- (a) a district ward; or
- (b) a county electoral division -

that area shall additionally be transferred to that ward or division.

### Amalgamation of parishes

5 - (1) Each group of parishes shown in column 1 of Schedule 2 hereto shall, without change to the boundary of any district ward or county electoral division, be amalgamated to form a new parish to be named as indicated in column 2.

(2) There shall be a parish council for each of the following new parishes -

Amotherby

Lockton

Ampleforth

Nawton

Cropton

Nunnington

Ebberston and Yedingham

Sheriff Hutton

Hawnby

Terrington

Westow

(3) From 1st April 1986 until the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1987, each new parish council shall consist of the persons who, immediately prior to 1st April 1986, held an office described in column 3.

- (4) For the purposes of the parish elections held in 1987 and thereafter -
- (a) the new parish of Ebberston and Yedingham shall be divided into two parish wards of Ebberston and Yedingham, each consisting of the area of the identically-named parish immediately prior to 1st April 1986.
- the number of parish councillors for each new parish or parish ward (as the case may be) shall be that shown in column 4.
- (5) Each parish listed in column 1 and each parish authority listed in column 5 shall be abolished! The residuary successor of each abolished authority shall be the council common parish council, or parish meeting and trustees (as the case may be) of the relevant new parish shown in column 2, and that council or parish meeting and trustees shall also assume custody of the public books and documents of the abolished parish.
- (6) There shall be a common parish council for the new parish of Hovingham and the parish of Scackleton. From 1st April 1986 until the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1987, that council shall consist of the members of the Hovingham with Scackleton common parish council in office immediately prior to 1st April 1986. Thereafter, the parish of Hovingham shall be represented by 5 parish councillors, and the parish of Scackleton by 2.
- In the year beginning on 1st April 1986, the district council shall levy rates in each new parish mentioned below, and make payments to each new parish council, common parish council or parish meeting (as the case may be) as if that parish council or the chairman of that parish meeting had issued a precept to the district council requiring the payment of a sum equal to the product of the

relevant amount in the pound shown below, calculated on the total rateable value of the new parish as set out in the valuation list at the beginning of that financial year.

## Consequential changes to petty sessional divisions

- 6. (1) The new parishes of Ampleforth and Ebberston and Yedingham shall form part of the Ryedale petty sessional division.
- (2) The new parishes of Hawnby and Old Byland and Scawton shall form part of the Birdforth petty sessional division.

## Consequential changes to coroner's districts

- 7.- (1) The new parishes of Ampleforth and Old Byland and Scawton shall form part of the Scarborough and Ryedale coroner's district.
- (2) The new parish of Hawnby shall form part of the Western coroner's district.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order.)

This order makes major changes to parishes in the district of Ryedale.

It -

- (a) Creates 18 new parishes by the amalgamation of a total of 45 parishes; and
- (b) transfers other areas between parishes.

The map forming part of this note (page 10) gives a general guide to the area affected by this order as from 1st April 1986.

Prints of the detailed boundary maps referred to in article 3 may be inspected at the offices of the district council, and may be purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB.

Parish councils are established for some of the new parishes.

Consequential changes are made to local government electoral areas.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 mentioned in article 2 contain further provisions about the effect and implementation of orders such as the present one.
